- Progressed another 3 School Streets schemes to restrict traffic outside schools and support active travel
- Supported WoW Tracker in Cardiff schools Wow is a pupil-led initiative
 where children self-report how they get to school every day. If they travel
 sustainably (walk, cycle or scoot) once a week for a month, they get rewarded
 with a badge.
- Promoted use of active travel-themed educational resources including lesson plans linked to Curriculum Newydd
- Promoted Active Travel Schools Programme through a dedicated Twitter feed
